Student Community Warden Scheme

Look out for the Student Community Wardens in your area!

Student Community Wardens give advice and guidance to students living in the community. They help foster positive relationships between students and permanent residents and provide advice on how to be considerate neighbours, how to minimise noise disturbance and manage waste and recycling effectively. They also provide guidance on how students can keep themselves and their property safe.

Student Community Wardens work during the semester time and cover streets around Headington campus and in East Oxford.

Community Engagement Team

Oxford Brookes values its relationship with the local community and its Community Engagement team seeks to help foster positive relationships between students and permanent local residents. The team provides advice and guidance to help them settle into their community.

There is a complaints procedure in place to address any concerns raised to the University by local residents regarding poor student behaviour. The team works collaboratively with Oxford City Council and Thames Valley Police to deal with incidents of antisocial behaviour. Any student who is found to have breached the Student Conduct Procedures, on or off campus, may incur an appropriate penalty, such as a fine or unpaid community service.

Top tips on how to be good neighbours...

Keep noise levels reasonable at all times

- Keep noise to a minimum when making your way home.
- Contain noise by closing doors and windows.
- Excessive noise at ANY time is unacceptable.



- Inform your neighbours in advance.
- Hold it at the weekend.
- Invite a sensible number of guests.
- Keep noise and music to reasonable levels.
- You are responsible for your guests.
- Limit the number of parties you hold at your property.

- Only use licensed minicabs or an officially marked taxi rank.
- Drink alcohol responsibly and do not leave your drink unattended.
